WHAT DOES KCM ADVISORS DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

What?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:

- Social Security number and investment experience
- Account balances and transaction history
- Assets and income

When you are *no longer* our customer, we can continue to share your information to process transactions, respond to court orders and legal investigations, or report to credit bureaus as described below in this notice.

How?

All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons KCM Advisors. ("KCM") chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Why can't I limit all sharing? Definitions

Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. <p style="text-align: center;">KCM has no affiliated financial companies</p>

Non-affiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ KCM does not share with non-affiliates so they cannot market to you.

Joint marketing	A formal agreement between non-affiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ KCM does not jointly market.

Other important information

Information for Vermont, Nevada and California Customers

In response to a Vermont regulation, if we disclose personal information about you to non-affiliated third parties with whom we have joint marketing agreements, we will only disclose your name, address, other contact information, and information about our transactions or experiences with you.

Nevada law requires us to disclose that you may request to be placed on our "do not call" list at any time by calling 1-619-400-8769. In response to a California law, we automatically treat accounts with California billing addresses as if you do not want to disclose personal information about you to non-affiliated third parties except as permitted by the applicable California law. We will also limit the sharing of personal information about you with our affiliates to comply with all California privacy laws that apply to us.
